WINGHAM HIGH SCHOOL Year 12 students have been extremely successful in gaining positions and awards prior to the completion of their HSC.

8 out of our 10 applicants for early entry to Southern Cross University SCU at Lismore, Coffs Harbour, and Tweed Heads, have been offered guaranteed Early Entry positions in degrees. One other student is awaiting the outcome of an interview for her Early Entry position at SCU.

We have a large number of students who have been made offers and provisional offers at The University of Canberra and the University of Wollongong.

We expect even more Early Entry Offers from The University of New England in Armidale to be announced soon.

One student will get 5 ATAR points from The University of New South Wales based on application and Interview.

Another two students have been awarded The Vice Chancellors Scholarships at The University of Newcastle and The University of New England.

Many of our students will take advantage of regional ATAR points offered to our students as being part of the Regional Network for The University of Wollongong, The University of Newcastle, Southern Cross University and Charles Sturt University. Representatives from these universities visit our school on a number of occasions each year. Most universities are offering bonus ATAR points to students gain Bands 5 and 6 in subjects relative to their degrees.

A large number of our Year 12 (25), are already making applications for apprenticeships and traineeships and TAFE courses. A small number (5) have already started the sign up for traineeships locally.

Two Year 10 students have been offered apprenticeships for next year one in plumbing and the other in a dairy. These positions have come out of our work experience program.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR CAREER EDUCATION

CAREER LINK - (CAL) - 2010

The Career Link class of 2010 started out as two classes of 20 students in Year 11 2009 and finished with 22 students in one class at the end of 2010.

One student transferred to a Central Coast school and another 18 students gained employment as permanent employees, apprentices, trainees or enrolled in full time TAFE.

School Based Apprentices Trainees (SbAT's)

A large number of our CAL students gained SbAT's and have successfully transitioned into employment and training.

Apprentice Metal Trades: Brendan CROSS – Wingham Beef – Brendan continues into his second year full time in 2011.

Trainee Civil Construction: Marcus BLANCH - GTCC

Trainee Green keeping: Mitch PEDRON – Wingham Golf Club

Trainee Dairy Industry: Brenan NASH – Bungay Dairy – Brendan will enter full time employment at Bungay in 2011.

Trainee Automotive: Nathan DANTL – Wingham Tyres and Exhausts. Nathan will continue employment in 2011

Trainee Health Services Assistants: Luana WOODHOUSE, Kaley BARNETT, Lainie WILLIAMS: Hunter Health Care – Manning Rural Referral Hospital – All three are eligible for University Early Entry in Bachelor of Nursing (Registered Nurse) at SCU and UNE as a result of their SbAT and successful completion of their Cert. III in HAS through TAFE.

FLASH DRIVES

Many students are using Flash Drives (Thumb Drives) to back up and carry work between home and school. We realise that this is a necessary tool but request that you have your student put their name on their drive as they are easily lost or forgotten and it could be quite devastating to the student if this work is lost. We suggest that you purchase a plastic key tag and clearly mark the students name and a contact telephone number and attach it to the drive, so that when one turns up the staff and other students can quickly return it to its rightful owner. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

ABSENCE NOTES AND LEAVE PASS NOTES

It is increasingly difficult to process notes explaining student absences and requests for leave passes as there is often a lack of information on them. We request that parents writing notes please include the student's first and last name and school year. Also, the first and last name of the parent/carer if your surname is different to your child's. We also require a reason for the leave request, e.g. appointment, sick etc. The time that your child needs to leave and will be returning to school is also extremely important. If we have an emergency evacuation we need to be able to verify the whereabouts of all students at all times.

Also, if your student will be arriving late to school for any reason they **MUST BE** accompanied by a parent/carer to sign them in or provide at note explaining their lateness. If a note is not provided the student will be marked unjustified and dealt with by the deputy principal.

We are quite tolerant of students attending appointments in school time within reason. While Doctor, Dentist/Orthodontist appointments that cannot be made after hours are acceptable, hairdressing/nail etc appointments are more likely to be frowned upon and refused. Also, a reminder that Friday afternoon is sport afternoon and sport is a compulsory component of the junior curriculum.
