

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

There have been many student achievements to celebrate this term. Successes have come our way on many sporting fields particularly in team events: Touch, Soccer, Rugby League as well as the Ag team at local shows and the Royal Easter Show. Recently we had a small group of students volunteer to assist at the Wingham Court Nursing Home. This program has been a highlight of the term for the school and students involved.



I have previously written about the New Syllabuses in English, Maths, Science and History being implemented in 2014. As a result many staff have been busy planning for this. The DEC has scheduled 2 school development days (pupil free) at the start of term 2, 2013 (Monday 29th & Tuesday 30th April). On these days staff will be heavily involved in unpacking the new syllabuses and familiarising themselves with new programming tools being provided by the Board of Studies. Other Faculties will be undertaking professional learning in areas to support the implementation of their syllabuses in coming years. These workshops will focus on "accommodations and adjustments" for students who have additional learning needs.

The New Vocational Education Training (VET) course requirements are being implemented this year so we have arranged for the Regional VET coordinator to present workshops to our VET teachers to ensure compliance to meet regional audit requirements.

Speaking of regions it has been confirmed by the Minister of Education and Communities Mr Adrian Piccoli that from 2014 regions will no longer exist within the new structure of the NSW DEC as a result of the functional realignment. The new structure will have 4 Areas across the state (replacing 8 regions). I have included the DEC map of the new structure later in this newsletter.

I have recently been informed by the DEC Assets Management Unit that we are to lose a demountable classroom due to declining enrolments. I have nominated the demountable located in the senior quad as our preferred option. The reasons I have chosen this demountable is that if we are to lose a teaching space we can at least gain something for the students from the loss, ie. playground space. We have been discussing for some time the rejuvenation of the senior quad and its use as a study area. If we manage to get through the red tape associated with this process we will commence planning for this important project. I have already set funds aside for the initial stages. I appreciate the support already offered by the P&C to achieve the removal of this particular demountable.

There were fantastic performances by **Hayley Watt**, accompanied by Jai Harrison and the marvellous display of talent by our gymnasts: **Kate and Daniel Stocks** ; (with Kate also as choreographer) **Brianna McCann** and **Dylan Webster**, as well as **Josh Essery** and **Jarrad Gibbons** working to ensure the smooth running of it all from behind the scenes. Congratulations also to **Caitlyn Cameron** and **Nathan Rowe** as age champions in the Cross Country – well done!

Year 11: Senior Success seems to be working really well for those students who have availed themselves of this program – remember for Week 2 of Term 2, you need a study program / plan ready to show and discuss how it's working for you. SYDNEY ART EXCURSION

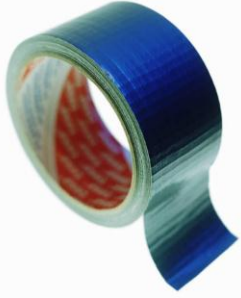

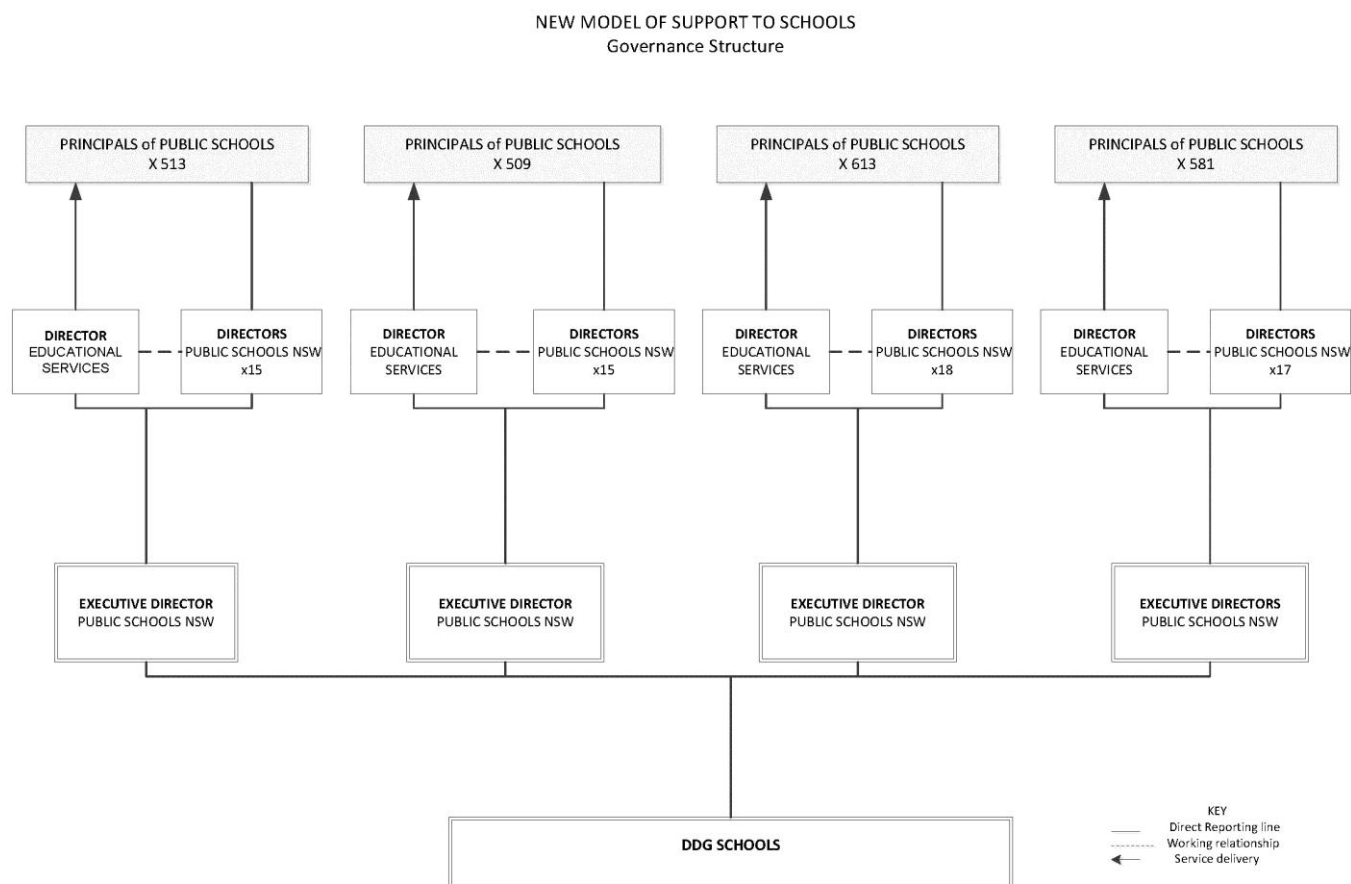
Sydney Royal Show 2013

Wingham High sent a team of 10 students from yrs 8-11 down to the royal Easter show on the 18th of March for the week to display 3 animals that had specific targets to meet being weight, muscle and fat cover. We also had 4 students qualify for the RAS state paraders they were Briana Hartup, Jonty Hemmingway, Nikita Gallagher and ex-student Madeline Coomber. Leaving on the Monday was the long drive down we had Mr Charlie Cassels agriculture teacher at this school and 2 very special parents Tamera Murray and Matt Hartup take cars of students down. Once there cattle were unloaded and put in stalls at the show the students had to set up camp at Agnus Banks Equine Veterinary Clinic, which the owners of very kindly let us stay. Tuesday was when the cattle were weighed and then scanned on the rump and rib for mm of fat. Wednesday was trade steer (more than one breed) judging which we had to animals in a (Charolaise x angus)x Murray Grey heifer led by Jonty Hemmingway and a (Charolaise x angus) x angus steer led by Victoria Lee breed at Wingham High unfortunately we didn't place then was the school paraders competition, our school was represented by Jakob Osmond leading our Simmental purebred school steer Harry donated by Max Dench. 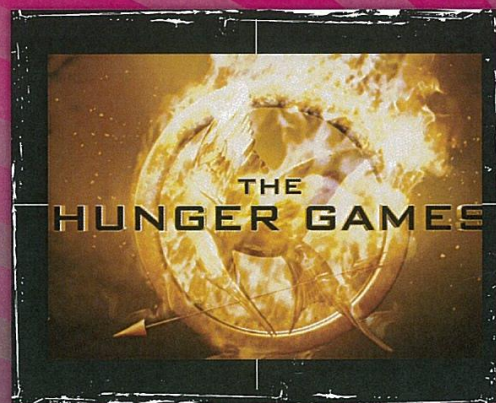

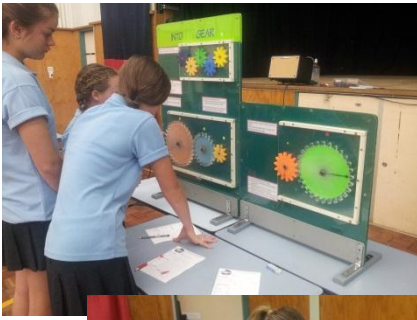
