#### **MAKE ONLINE PAYMENTS**

It is now possible for parents to make online payments to the school for amounts owing for students, via a secure payment page hosted by Westpac. Payments can be made using either a Visa or MasterCard credit or debit card. The payment page is accessed from the front page of the schools website by selecting \$ Make a payment

Items that can be paid include voluntary school contributions, subject contributions, excursions, sales to students and creative and practical arts activities (these include band, drama and dance). There is also a category called Other this to cover items not covered in the previous headings, Other can be used to make a complete payment of a school invoice.

When you access the \$ Make a payment you must enter:

the students name, and class and reference number OR the students name, and date of birth.

These details are entered each time you make a payment as student information is not held within the payment system. There is also the option to enter the Student Registration Number and Invoice number if you are aware of them, these are optional fields.

This is a secure payment system hosted by Westpac to ensure that your credit/debit card details are captured in a secure manner, these details are not passed back to the school.

You have the ability to check and change any details of the payment before the payment is processed. Receipts can be emailed and/or printed.

Details of the payments are passed daily to the school where they will be receipted against your child's account. As a receipt has been issued from the payment page a further receipt will not be issued by the school.

#### SYDNEY ROYAL EASTER SHOW

On Monday 23rd March, 15 students arrived at Wingham High's Agriculture Department at around 7am. Glenn Gallagher arrived with the cattle truck and we loaded our 5 steers. We departed for Sydney, a few in Charlie Cassel's car, a few in Gallagher's truck and the rest in the WHS mini bus.

We arrived at Sydney, the cattle truck and Charlie's car headed straight to the showground to sort out the cattle and unload them. The bus went straight to Baden Powell Scout Complex and unloaded the gear then on to the showground and we spent the rest of the afternoon feeding and watering the steers and setting up our gear. We got back to the Scout Complex around 6pm where we were staying with Kempsey High and Camden High.

On Wednesday 25th, we were up early as we had to get to the showground early for the weighing, fat scanning and re-tagging of our 5 steers. The weighing was split into 3 categories; trade, school steers and purebred. Each handler had to take their steer through the crush to be weighed to decide which class they would be judged in, have their tag changed to their registration number for competition, and have a fat scan completed over the rib and rump area to tell the judge how well covered they are.

On Thursday 26th, we were at the showground by 5:30am. Our 2 Fleckvieh steers had their classes on this day. These 2 steers were our main focus, they were washed, blow dried, hair sprayed and brushed until they gleamed. Although neither of our steers placed in their classes, it was still a great experience for the handlers to have had the chance to show at the 2015 Sydney Royal Easter Show.

After all the classes were finished, the auction commenced. The 2 Fleckvieh steers were led around the auctioneer ring by their handlers. The big Fleckvieh (as pictured below) was sold to Wingham Beef Exports for \$2.55 per kg and the smaller Fleckvieh for \$2.65per kg.

After all the events were done we were able to go around and see the show for a few hours and then watch the opening night performance in the main arena.

On Friday 27th, the only event for the day was parading. Jessica Hudson, a year 9 student of WHS competed in the RAS parading competition. Although she didn't place, she was still a strong competitor and did WHS proud. The showteam then went around the show and checked out the different pavilions and events.

Overall, the 15 students whom attended this excursion all had many amazing experiences and formed strong friendships. This excursion for the Wingham High Show Team we scored 2 bronze medals in the carcase competition from the big Fleckvieh and steer 213.

A huge congratulations to those attending; Rachel Atkins, Cassey Williams, Hayley Brood, Kate Stocks, Teanna Peckett, Jake Brood, Aaron Walker, Reilly Brown, Dylan Brown, Jessica Hudson, Sophie French, BJ Woolfe, Charles Turner, Emily Brood and Patrick Gallagher.

#### The Manning Valley 'Boy Soldier'


On Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> April Wingham High School was invited to attend the Manning Valley Historical Society's (MVHS) dedication of the Society's tribute to 'Boy Soldiers', based on a locally born boy named John 'Jack' Lancelot Andrews. Year 9 students Amira Cuthbertson, Chloe Moran-Choppin, Abbey McKay and Theo Van Zalm and Miss Tiffany White walked to the Wingham Museum on behalf of WHS. Here we were met by President of the MVHS Barbara Waters who at 10am gave the welcome and honorary speech in front of Eric Richardson OAM (local historian and Vice President of the MVHS), Stephen Bromhead (MP), Rev. Darrel McKeough, members of the Andrews family, other descendents of John Andrews and the members of the public.

After Barbara's welcome, Stephen Bromhead gave a thought-provoking commemorative speech identifying four qualities of the ANZAC legend; courage, selflessness, tenacity and mateship. He asked those in attendance to reflect on those qualities and ask ourselves if we have been brave, shown tenacity and mateship and are selfless in our everyday lives and that particularly for the centenary anniversary that all should consider truly what those qualities mean. Next Rev. Darrel McKeough gave the dedication to Jack's tribute while Kay Andrews unveiled the plaque commemorating his experiences and memory.

After the official opening of the tribute, everyone was invited to examine records of Jack's history, enlistment, medical reports, and some more personal artefacts such as his dog tags and personal letters and silk embroidered postcards he sent home from France. Jack was only 15 years and 8 months old when he enlisted landing first in France and then Belgium where he joined the 54<sup>th</sup> Battalion. Unfortunately, he was killed in action in 1917 when a shell hit the trench that he and 12 others perished in. He was only 16.

The Year 9 WHS students in attendance were very respectful and enjoyed learning about Jack's history, engaging with the other patrons and looking at other WWI memorabilia commenting on the size of the machine guns used, gas masks, dog tags and rations the soldiers were given.

After our investigation, we joined everyone for a morning tea where we were offered scones and jam, ANZAC biscuits and other treats while we mingled and spoke with members of the public and other attendants. In particular, we were welcomed by Barbara and Stephen and both took the time to speak with us and ask about our current study of WWI and the school's involvement in the ANZAC ceremonies being held over the following days leading up to and on the 100<sup>th</sup> ANZAC anniversary.









#### BEEF WEEK REPORT

The 28th Wingham Beef Week was held during week 4 in May 2015. A year of preparation by Mr Hawkins and Mr Cassels as part of the Beef Week committee culminated in a highly organised and educational events for our students.

The week began on Monday, 11th May with our Primary School 'Day at the Farm' where 90 local primary school students rotated through organised workshops concerning the various enterprises on the school farm with a focus on skills and cattle. The day was developed with the guidance of Hayley Brood yr11, who organised the groups/activities and team leaders. This was a highly successful day and an excellent opportunity for the year 6's introduction to high school life as part of orientation.

Wingham High hosted 19 high schools from across the state this year for the main Beef Week competition, we had on average 300 students per day competing in the parading, judging and beef appreciation activities. Approximately 350 students competed from both public and private schools from across the state for the week on a daily basis.

A very big thank you goes out to Mr Grant Coleman and the Wingham Beef Exports staff for their generosity in the use of their facilities and resources. The Beef Week competition is seen across the state as an excellent example of industry, schools and community linkages coming together for the greater learning of our students. It is unique to have such community and industry support.

Our students were successful in a range of areas of the beef competition and the results include:

- ◆ Champion Team for Retail Beef Cut Judging Teanna Peckett, Kate Stocks, Brooke Anderson, Hayley Brood.
- Reserve Champion Beef Appraisal Team Overall Kate Stocks, Brooke Anderson, Hayley Brood, Jake Brood.
- ♦ Kate Stocks won the Wingham High School Award for a course at Tocal Agriculture College on Beef Cattle Assessment.
- ♦ Sienna Hawkins went on to become a runner up in the Junior Meat Judging Competition in a strong field of 340 students.
- Brooke Anderson again won the Junior Judging of Cattle, competing against a large and strong competition which is outstanding from a field of 240 other students. Brooke was the guest associate judge this year because of her win last year and also won her Parader's class which is outstanding and she showed real class on the day.
- The schools Red Angus (Mr Cassel's favourite) achieved the Highest Marbling score for the competition and was picked out by abattoir staff and given the accolade as the Number One MSA Carcase.
- Our 5 steers entered on the day did not win overall, but took out Middleweight class in a large group of entries.

Our current show team plus interested Agriculture students conducted themselves as great ambassadors for Wingham High School for the whole week.

This years Beef Week was well covered in the media from TV interviews to the Focus magazine, Wingham Chronicle and ABC rural radio programs. A big thank you goes out to Mrs Maree Gilbert for all her work to get the Monday barbecues organised (600 sausages in one day) and Mr and Mrs Brood for their work all week (day and night) to make it happen for the kids.

The 2016 Beef Week program is now in the planning stage and Mr Hawkins and Mr Cassels would really appreciate some parents and community members to join our team to continue to deliver this highly educational industry based program.


