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Authentic Assessment

Another successful Authentic Assessment again this year. Students presented three tasks completed throughout the year to a panel of three people consisting of a teacher, a community member and a Year 9 student, which simulates a real-life interview. We had 88 students complete their interviews with 32% receiving an 'Outstanding' and 42% receiving a 'High'. This process can be very daunting for many students as it is the first ever experience of a real interview, but provides invaluable skills for the future.

We also advertised for community members for the first time so we had a mixture of our very dedicated regular panel members and some new recruits. Some of the remarks from our community members include "A superb educational experience for all involved" and "Being able to provide constructive support to the students, offering tools and advice".

Next year's interviews will be Wednesday 5th and Thursday 6th of December. We will be streamlining our processes for next year and are continually looking for community members to assist our students in gaining confidence and skills for the future.
