Programs for Senior Students

Term 4 2020 and Term 1 2021

A number of programs are on offer for students in Years 10, 11 and 12. All programs are delivered in a small group setting by Mrs Austin. Each program consists of 6-8 sessions that take 50 minutes each to complete. Each session is designed to provide skills to be practised and applied by the students for the remainder of the program. Students can express interest in one or more of the following programs.

Study Without Stress Program

The Study Without Stress Program is theoretically grounded in the cognitive behavioural approach. The program is delivered in a small group setting and is targeted at students approaching or in their final years of school.

Topics covered in the program:

- Education about stress causes, symptoms, role of stress
- Managing stressful thoughts
- Timetabling and study/life balance
- Relaxation techniques
- Preparing for exams
- Understanding perfectionism and procrastination
- Tips to deal with work avoidance and building good study habits
- Problem solving
- Building Study Habits Program

The Building Study Habits Program is aimed at students who would like to improve their organisation and approach to study in the senior years of school.

Topics covered in the program:

- Timetabling and study/life balance
- Creating study habits
- Organisation techniques
- Creating a planner that works for you
- Breaking down assessment tasks
- Study techniques
- Summarising text
- Tips to deal with work avoidance and building good study habits

7 Habits Program

The 7 Habits Program is a set of tools to help you be happy and successful. The program follows the book '7 Habits of Highly Effective Teens' by Sean Covey. Students will learn about a habit each week and be given practical ways to implement them into their lives.

Topics covered in the program:

Habit 1: Be Proactive - Take responsibility for your life.

Habit 2: Begin with the End in Mind - Set goals for yourself.

Habit 3: Put First Things First - Prioritise, and do the most important things first.

Habit 4: Think Win-Win - Have an everyone-can-win attitude.

Habit 5: Seek First to Understand, Then to Be Understood - Listen to people sincerely.

Habit 6: Synergise - Work together to achieve more.

Habit 7: Sharpen the Saw - Renew yourself regularly.

"Geography is such an important subject because it develops in students a holistic understanding of the world around them, and their place in it," said Ms Berg.

The Competition is a joint initiative of the Australian Geography Teachers' Association and the Royal Geographical Society of Queensland. In addition to the funding from Australian Department of Education, Skills and Employment, sponsorship is received from the University of Queensland and University of Western Australia.

Australian Off-Road Championships

We are very proud of how both our boys competed in their first year of racing with the Australian Off-Road Championship 2020(AORC).

Cooper (Year 7) competed in the J1 Class (85cc small wheel) in the AORC. There were 25 riders competing in his class. After the 3 Rounds Cooper was on equal 1st on points with Mason Boucher of Victoria and came out with a 2nd place due to count back on places. He was super excited about his results. Cooper is looking forward to moving up to the J2 class and earning a spot on the Podium in 2021. Cooper will be competing in the AORC and NSW Off-Road Championship in 2021 and is eager to compete in a full year of racing and to better his results 2021.

"The closest finish of all the Championship classes was in the J1 class, proving to be a success in the first year the new 85cc class was run in the AORC.

Two riders – Mason Boucher and Cooper Boyd – tied on 56 points each, with Boucher taking out the championship on a count back for places. Lachlan Roche was able to secure third in the class on 53 points.

In fact, the top five riders were covered by a mere 16 points, such was the strong competition in the debut year for this class in 2020."

Second Place – Cooper Boyd – 56 Points

Third Place – Lachlan Roche – 53 Points

Blake (Year 9) raced in the J4 (125cc to 200cc 2-stoke 200cc to 250cc 4-stroke). There were 30 riders competing in his class. He had a very solid and consistent year on the bike. Blake was very happy to come 11th in Australia in his class. He is looking forward to again competing in the AROC and the NSW Off-Road Champion in 2021.
