#### From the Principal's Desk

Welcome back to what has been a start more in line to what we are usually accustomed to. The COVID-19 pandemic is obviously always central to planning and we continue to keep abreast of the daily updates, we are committed to making the learning environment as stable and structured to allow all students to continue to move forward in their learning. So, whilst 'business as usual' is clearly different to past practice, our classrooms are focused on student learning and best possible learning outcomes.

Whilst the year has definitely impacted on all of our students, I definitely feel for the students completing their HSC this year. The end of six years of schooling is not quite as expected. Again, we are ensuring that learning is as close to what would previously occur. Part of the students' preparation is the Trial HSC Examinations. Students will still be sitting these exams during weeks 5 and 6. That is; Monday 17th August until Friday 28th August inclusive. We of course will be supporting students outside of their allocated exam times, where they can be on campus and access teacher support.

The school is busy in the early stages of a new planning cycle. Our new School Improvement Plan, which entails a 4 year planning period, asks for schools to provide a clear snapshot of their current performance. Wingham High is in the process of gathering as much information so that our decisions are well founded and are goals can then be clearly defined. To help with all this information gathering we will be asking parents and community for their thoughts on different matters within the school. Your thoughts will be of great significance. Those surveys (COVID will likely limit a lot of interaction to online collection) will be coming out in the not too distant future.

### **Careers News**

#### **Year 12**

I am in the process of interviewing every student in Year 12 as part of their transition from school to university, TAFE or employment. These interviews are a great opportunity for students to discuss individual plans, ideas and options for their future. Parents are welcome to attend these interviews by phone or zoom. Unfortunately, the Year 12 Careers Evening for students and their parents will not be able to go ahead this year as it has in previous years. However parents are most welcome to call me if you have any particular questions regarding your child's transition from school.

Whilst, due to COVID 19 Year 12 have not been able to participate in Careers Excursions this year, students are encouraged to attend university, TAFE and private provider Open Days virtually. These Open Days will take place throughout August and September. A number of the universities are also running Parent Information Sessions which are also a valuable way to find out institution specific information.

#### **EVET/TAFE**

Students in Year 9, 10 or 11 have the opportunity to study a TAFE course for next year one day per week. Students must fill in an Expression of Interest Form – there is only a short window of opportunity to do this until September 4.

#### **Macquarie University Conference**

Macquarie University brought their InRoads Program to Wingham High School virtually on Thursday 30th and Friday 31st July. This program is funded by the Federal Government as part of Macquarie University's LEAP (Learning Education Aspiration Participation) Program to encourage regional students to aspire to university study.

We had a representative Lotus here with us on site and each of the presenters zoomed in. This program would normally take place on campus in Sydney or with the presenters all coming to Wingham. Unfortunately, this was not possible this year due to COVID 19.

The sessions the students heard about were Astrophysics, Linguistics, International Business, Security Studies and Criminology, Biological Sciences, Media, Communication and Cultural Studies, Law Society, MQ Sport, Global Leadership, MQ Accommodation, Campus Wellbeing and Cognitive Sciences. These sessions showcased some of the range of disciplines available at Macquarie University.




### Garden


