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From the Principal's Desk

As we near the end of the first semester, I think it fair to say that we continue to face different challenges in our new normal. I am sure it has been reported home the

inconsistencies of classroom teachers at different times across the semester. We continue in our efforts to attract new staff to support our programs at school and staff illness so that students have qualified teachers before them each day. It has unfortunately been the case where students needed supervising in the quad due to lack of casual staff. This is something we have taken every step to avoid in the past and we will continue to have learning conducted in class in the future. It impacts on learning as we well know but also the student familiarity and the relationships developed with their teachers.

Having stated the above we have tried to continue the varied learning experiences provided by the school. We continue with our iTrack program with year 11 students being supported by external mentors for post school transition and our Growth Mindset Intervention for Teens (GRIT) program for identified students being supported through the PCYC. Unfortunately, our excursion to Sydney to watch the Bangarra Dance had to be postponed because of the dreaded COVID but should be an opportunity in early Term 3.

A great initiative for our wider school communities was run once again by Mrs Karlyn Hawkins. This enabled the students of the Manning opportunity to engage with teachers who provided them with insights into successful HSC response, study and advice. This is an awesome opportunity and was well supported with over 150 students involved from an array of high schools in our area.

Our Excellence Assembly will return this year now that we can have parents back on campus. Our Semester 1 assembly is to be held in Term 3, Week 3. It is opportunity for those students who have excelled in the different aspects of school to be recognised and acknowledged for their focus and commitment. Those students and parents will be provided with more information about the evening early in term 3.

A big thank you to those parents who have registered on our Sentral Parent Portal. We are continuing to get more information out via this resource. I hope that the information and notifications are supportive. Through the portal, you can access your child's attendance and other relevant information. Of note with student attendance, all parents should receive an SMS when their child is absent. Here you can respond with information as to why they are not in attendance. Absences over three (3) days should be accompanied by a medical certificate. In times we are facing with COVID, students should remain at home if they have cold like symptoms and complete a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT). All students should have access to RATs. If you have run out of these, please contact the school as we have plenty in reserve.

Please be aware of the NSW Government's offer of free flu vaccinations in the month of June. It applies to all residents, so it is a great initiative to take advantage of.

Industrial Action Thursday, 30 June 2022

The NSW Teachers Federation has directed its membership to take industrial action in the form of a 24-hour strike on Thursday 30 June 2022. As a result of the strike, we will still be open but will be providing minimal student supervision on this date. Minimal supervision means onsite teaching and learning continues however temporary class structures and a modified timetable are required to meet safety and supervision requirements.

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The department has been negotiating with the NSW Teachers Federation since October last year to reach an agreement on the new Teachers Award.

As a department we are considering this change in relation to the Teachers Award, which is next before the Industrial Relations Commission (IRC) on 29 June 2022. Dates have been reserved in October 2022 for the Teachers Award matter to be arbitrated by a full bench of the IRC, and I am hopeful for a swift outcome after this process. Thank you for your support and understanding during this short period of disruption.






Manning Valley Historical Society Book Donation
